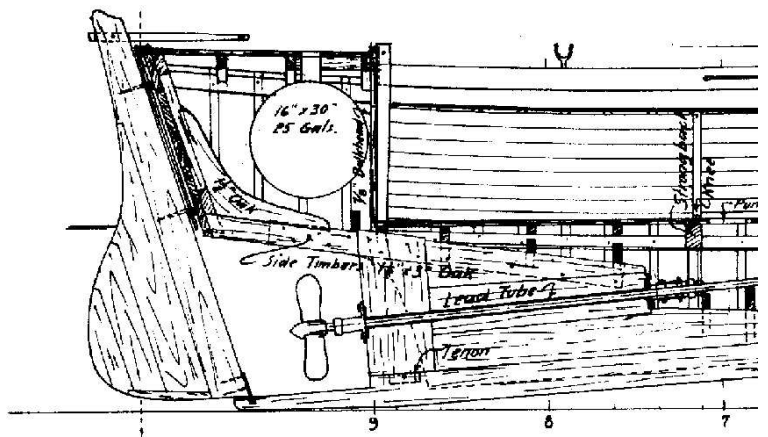

## Victorian dinghies

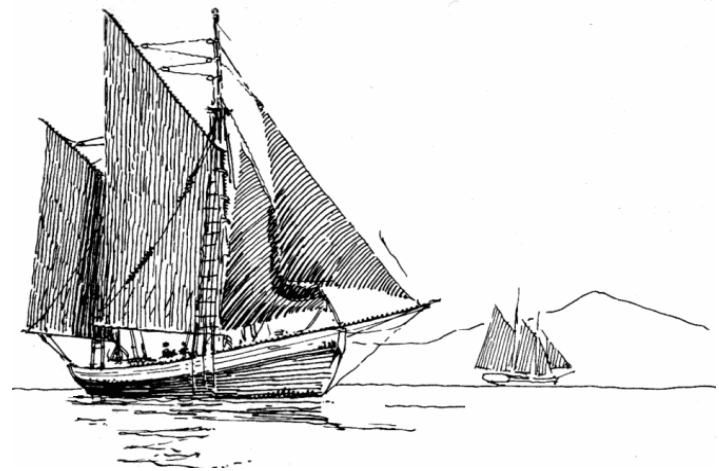
